Report on CRMD, 2023

With an unwavering commitment to the pursuit of academic excellence, Fr. ConceicaoRodrigues College of Engineering proudly marked the 25th year of its flagship event, theConceicao Rodrigues Memorial Debate (CRMD), from 6th to 7th October 2023. This momentous occasion was a testament to the enduring legacy of CRMD in nurturing young minds and fostering critical thinking.

The theme chosen for CRMD 2023, "Sustainable Coalescence: A Socio-Economic Odyssey,"encapsulated the essence of a quarter-century journey that has witnessed spirited debates, intellectual exploration, and a deep commitment to the art of persuasion. This theme sought to ignite discussions that spanned a diverse array of topics within the realm of socio-economics, emphasizing the need for sustainability and coalescence in our ever-evolving world.

CRMD, an intermediate Oxford-style debate competition, has consistently garnered acclaimfrom its witnesses. Debating enthusiasts and teams from all corners of India eagerly aspire to claim the prestigious CRMD trophy, show casing their debating prowess. The event took place at Fr. Conceicao Rodrigues College of Engineering, Bandra, drawing debaters from diversebackgrounds and regions, who convened to engage in intellectual discourse. The 25th Conceicao Rodrigues Memorial Debate started with the inaugural ceremony at Samvad on 6th October 2023. With a prayer song and lamp lightning by the dignitaries followed by a piece of wisdom enrichened by Director Fr. Valerian D'souza, Principal, and Ms. Achrekar, the chief guest for the event. The event was declared open by our Director.

The Quarterfinals, Semi-finals, and Final debates were accessible to a broad audience, ensuring an immersive experience for all participants.

The much-anticipated debate brought together an impressive assembly of 32 accomplishedteams, each representing diverse corners of the nation. These teams, armed with theirrhetorical skills and persuasive prowess, vied for the top honors, including a substantial firstprize of Rs. 40,000 and a second prize of Rs. 25,000. The event also recognized excellence in individual performance, with Rs.7,500 earmarked for the best speaker and the best adjudicator. The convergence of talent and intellect from all over the country made this competition an exciting show case of debating excellence and intellectualrigor.

Our judges, composed of experts from the realms of Communication, Education, and the Corporate world, played a pivotal role in the CRMD competition. Beyond evaluating the strengths and weaknesses of each argument, they offered candid yet constructive feedback to aid teams in their continuous improvement. Their assessment was marked by a blend of grace and eloquence, enhancing the overall debate experience.



Adjudicators, with their impartiality and equanimity, held a significant role in the proceedings. They meticulously documented the salient points presented by debaters, ensuring a fairassessment of each argument. Moreover, they provided valuable feedback, fostering thedevelopment of the participants.

The top 8 teams exhibited astute arguments during the quarterfinals, presenting compelling perspectives. From this rigorous competition, four teams emerged triumphant, securing their spots in the highly anticipated semi-finals.




